- To be able to identify ways that some people make a response to God by caring for others and the world.
- To talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from stories.
- To be able to talk about some texts from different religions that promote the 'Golden Rule', and think about what would happen if people followed this idea more.
- To be able to use creative ways to express their own ideas about the creation story and what it says about what God is like.
- To be able to give examples of ways in which believers put their beliefs about others and the world into action, making links with religious stories.
