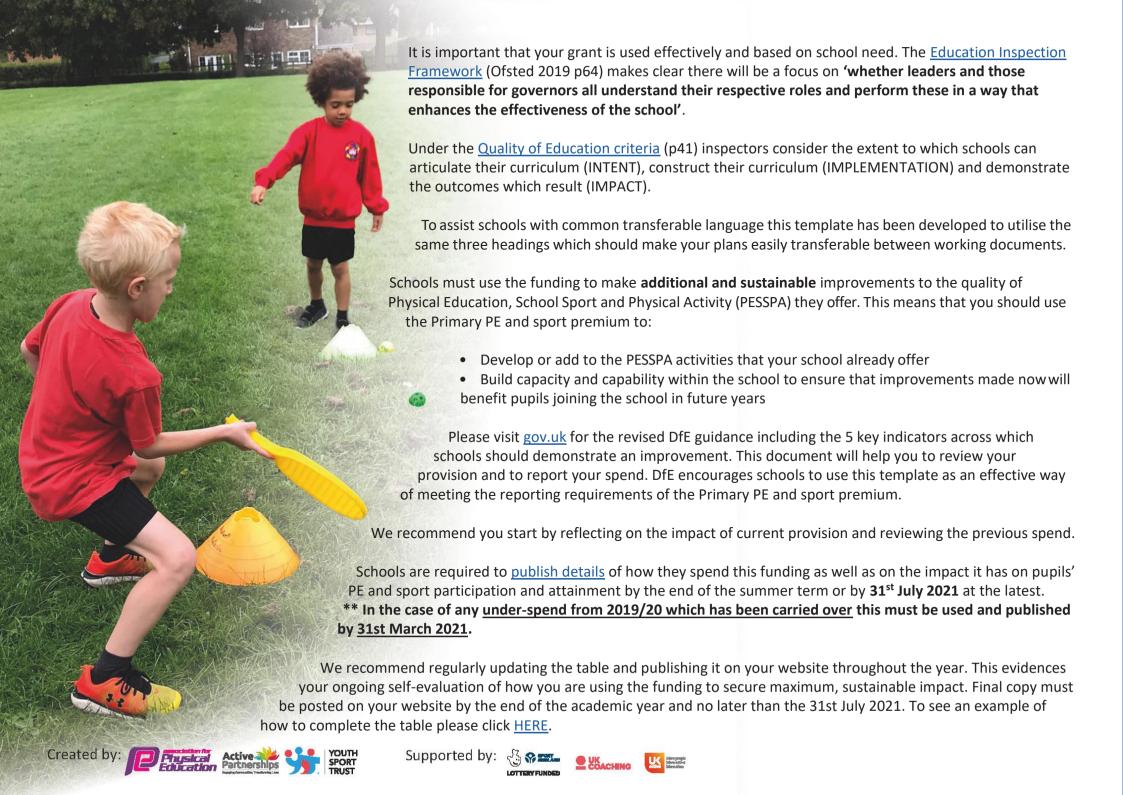

Play leader employed for active lunchtimes – not this year due to Covid -19 restrictions. High quality resources for children to use.

- Children more active during lessons active maths lessons (Maths of the Day)
- All children taking part in intra school competitions throughout the school year.
- Increase in number of children taking part in inter school competitions and festivals (Cross country, infant agility, dance and gymnastics festivals) – not this year due to Covid-19.
- Daily active activity Daily wake and shake and daily mile
- Children have had opportunities to experience different sports and create local club links - cricket - not this year due to Covid-19.
- Implemented new PE scheme of work

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Start-up afterschool clubs again when Covid-19 restrictions
- Increase the number for Pupil premium pupils attending after school clubs and being active during lunch time sessions when Covid-19 restrictions allow.
- Implement the new PE assessment tool.
- Develop leadership roles with children mini leaders to work with and support younger members of the school.
- Children more active during lunchtimes and playtimes re introduce play leader and mini leaders from the Junior school which had to be stopped due to Covid-19.
- Create more opportunities for children to be active during playtimes and lunch times.

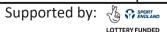
