Year 1 Term 1 Curriculum Plan for Parents

The information below outlines the areas we will be working on this term in each of the curriculum subjects.

Writing:

This term our key texts are;

- Elmer by David Mckee
- Peace at Last by Jill Murphy
- Funny Bones by Janet and Allan Ahlberg

Using these texts, we will be focusing on:

- Using a range of guestion words.
- Using adjectives to describe.
- Using the conjunction 'and', and 'because'.
- Using a capital letter and full stop to punctuate sentences.
- Structuring a letter correctly.
- Segmenting and blending words.
- Writing simple definitions.
- Using the pronoun "I" to talk about feelings.
- Writing in the first person.
- Using a capital letter for names, places and the start of sentences.
- Writing factual statements.
- Using a capital letter for days of the week.
- Writing in speech bubbles.
- Writing lists.
- Using adjectives in a sentence.
- Editing and publishing our work.

Maths:

Place Value (within 10)

The first block of teaching will focus on Place Value:

- Sorting objects.
- Counting objects to 10.
- Counting objects from a larger group.
- Representing objects.
- Counting on from any number.
- Finding one more.
- Finding one less.
- Counting backwards.
- Comparing numbers using less than, greater than and equal to.
- Ordering numbers and objects.
- Using the number line.

Addition and Subtraction (within 20)

The second block of teaching will focus on Addition and Subtraction

Introducing parts and wholes.

- Finding a part and whole using a part-whole model.
- Writing number sentences.
- Finding fact families.
- Recalling number bonds to 10.
- Adding together.
- Adding more.
- Solving addition problems.
- Subtracting-finding a part.
- Recognising addition and subtraction fact families.
- Subtraction on a number line.
- Adding or subtracting 1 or 2 from a given number.

Science:

In Science we will be looking at 'seasonal changes' with a focus on:

- Naming the four seasons in order.
- Naming the seasons and the typical weather associated with each season.
- Describing how the leaves on a tree change across the seasons.
- Recognising that summer has the most daylight hours and winter has the least amount of daylight hours.
- Recording data about temperatures.
- Labelling a map of the UK with weather symbols.

History:

Our History topic this term is called 'How am I making History?' and we will be:

- Looking at how I have grown and changed.
- Ordering photos on a timeline.
- Using the words before and after when using a timeline.
- Talking about memories and why they are special to us.
- Looking at celebrations that are celebrated across the year.
- Discussing their own birthday celebrations.
- Knowing the difference between childhood and now.
- Using the words past, present and future.

Art:

Our Art and Design topic this term is called 'Painting and mixed media; Colour splash and we will be:

- Naming the primary colours.
- Mixing primary colours to make secondary colours.
- Using a range of materials and equipment when painting.
- Painting in the style of Clarice Cliff and Jasper Johns.

Computing:

In Term 3 we will be looking at Technology around us and we will be:

- Explaining that technology is something that can help us.
- Finding examples of technology.
- Finding examples of how technology can help us.
- Knowing that a computer is an example of technology.

- To know that choices are made when using technology.
- To know why rules are needed when using technology

PSHE:

Our PSHE topic this term is called 'Being Responsible' and we will be:

- Learning about rules and why different rules are needed for different situations.
- Discussing that people and other living things have different needs and understand the responsibilities of caring for them.
- Finding out how we can look after their environment.
- Discussing different roles and responsibilities people have in their community.

In Music we will be:

Listening and Appraising the song 'In The Groove' and other songs in the style of Old-School Hip Hop. We will be listening to Me, Myself And I by De La Soul, Fresh Prince Of Bel-Air by Will Smith, Rapper's Delight by The Sugarhill Gang, U Can't Touch This by MC Hammer and It's Like That by Run DMC.

In PE we will be learning:

Personal Skills:

- To be able to listen carefully to instructions.
- To be able to keep your head up and stay within marked areas.
- To be able to keep going when things are hard.
- To be able to think about who you can ask for help.

Fundamental Movement Skills:

- To be able to keep your head up.
- To be able to bend your knees to help balance.
- To be able to work off the balls of your feet.

Static balance: One leg

- To be able to keep your head up and still.
- To be able to keep your tummy (core muscles) tight and your back straight.

Religious Education

This term will be exploring the question: Who is a Christian and what do they believe? (Christianity Focus) we will be learning that;

- Christians believe in God and follow the example of Jesus.
- The cross is a Christian symbol and represents Jesus' death and resurrection.
- The dove is another Christian symbol that represents the Holy Spirit.
- The candle flame is another Christian symbol and represents Jesus as the light of the world.
- Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God.
- Some Christians follow the teaching from the Bible about how to live their lives.

Our focus books in RE are; Jonah and the Big Fish, David and Goliath, The Loaves and the Fishes.
